HORNE HOME "WALK FOR HOPE"

On September 19th, 7 members of OLBC walked a mile or two in support of the local home for the developmentally disable. Nineteen churches participated this year to raise \$11,744. This was 4 more churches than last year and \$2000 more in funds than last year. The funds raised go directly toward the upkeep and maintenance of the home itself. OLBC raised \$160 for this worthy cause.

Located at the corner of Mulberry Rd and Oakdale St, the Horne Home is a residence for women who are not able to live independently due to developmental disabilities. The Horne Home is funded through HopeTree Family Services in Salem, which operates about 18 residential homes throughout the state.

The Horne Home currently has four residents and a fifth comes occasionally for respite care. The ladies keep busy by working at locations such as the MARC Workshop or visiting non-profits such as Stepping Stone and Horizons.
