#### Ten Easy Steps to No Church Growth

There are hundreds of titles readily available to those of us who want to learn how to grow a church, but books outlining the best approaches to wreck a church are not so common. I sense a unique niche here, so here is a preliminary outline of ten easy steps almost any nominal church member may use in order to thwart harmony, discipleship, and soul winning.

Support and participate only in those events and programs that are most convenient for your sake and comfort, and be firm about taking no personal interest in the spiritual development of any other soul. If you won't be "getting anything out of it," simply ignore it.

Complain often to as many people as possible about your church and its members. Repeat rumors, belittle others, and look for the worst in people and situations. Be especially vocal with your criticism of the pastor, his family, and their involvement in church and community activities. Look for the most petty things to criticize such as sermon content and length, clothes, and lifestyles.

**Do not tithe.** It's alright to give a few dollars from time to time, but only give what you can reasonably afford after having paid all other bills and purchased important personal and luxury items for you and your family.

Never allow personal Bible study and prayer to interfere with your important schedule or crowd those things you count as priorities. As long as your job, family, recreation, and rest are at the top of your list you shouldn't be bothered by prayers other than those quickly recited at the dinner table or in an emergency. An uncommon amount of prayer or attention to spiritual matters may hamper relationships or cause you an unusual embarrassment or unwanted reputation.

When it is necessary to attend a worship service, Bible study, or ministry event, don't waste time taking notes or exploring Bible passages later at home. It is best to forget the message taught, and under no circumstance should you be driven by either guilt or the Holy Spirit to apply principles learned or change an attitude or opinion.

**Promote personal freedom of religion.** What one man considers sin another considers fun and normal. Don't be a judge of others' lifestyles and life choices. "What goes around comes around." If you begin thinking that there are serious consequences to the beliefs and pursuits of other men and women, you can be sure that your own actions and viewpoints will be called into question. Allow your children to explore faith on their own rather than forcing your beliefs on them.

When appropriate, affirm your belief in Jesus and God, but don't allow Him to Lord it over you. You must be realistic. You are responsible to live your own life and make all decisions this side of the grave. To believe that someone else actually owns your property or is concerned about your day to day affairs is very impractical and may cost you.

Have no concern for the needs of others. You have enough trouble and responsibility to keep you busy, and that leaves no room for compassion or interest in the hurts and crushing burdens of others. For those truly in need, there are many government agencies and benevolent organizations that have been created just for that purpose. Fewer attachments and relationships will help keep your own affairs in order.

**Never volunteer to share or cooperate with others in ministry.** There are too many who do not believe just like you do or who will drag you down with more work. Cooperation inevitably leads to disagreements and will require more time, energy, and money. As the old saying goes, "If you want something done right, just do it yourself."

NEVER admit your faults, NEVER ask forgiveness, and NEVER seek out what God genuinely thinks about a particular matter, unless it is to your advantage in winning an argument or gaining control over someone else.

If you will begin to practice these steps, you are guaranteed to stymie growth, create an atmosphere of distrust and discord, motivate your pastor to start praying for another place of service, become known even in circles outside church, and help more people to hell than you can imagine.

## Human Exploitation - Project Help(sm)

Ways to Engage

Motivate others to join a focus group in your church

to learn about trafficking and how to respond to the opportunities in your community.

There is still slavery in our world! If anyone thinks it's gone, think again. People need to be made aware of how people and the most vulnerable amongst us, the children, are still being used and abused through trafficking.

The National Human Trafficking Resource Center (NHTRC) is a national, toll-free hotline, available to answer calls from anywhere in the country, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, every day of the year. They are not a government entity, law enforcement or an immigration authority. Call: 1-888-3737-888

IN VIRGINIA: Update from the Virginia General Assembly: both the House and Senate have passed similar Bills that require the Board of Education, with assistance from the Department of Social Services, to provide awareness and training materials for local school divisions on human trafficking, including strategies for the prevention of trafficking of children.

Ideas and Resources to Join the Fight Against Modern Slavery: There is no perfect list of things you can do to make America slavery-free, but here we offer a few specific ideas to help you create positive change where you live. Many more ideas to combat trafficking are found in chapter 10 of Not in My Town.
