Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America.

It was borne out of the Civil War and a desire to honor the dead. General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, stated, "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land." The date of Decoration Day was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle. On that first Decoration Day at Arlington National Cemetery, 5,000 participants decorated the graves of 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there.

In World War I the United States was embroiled in another major conflict and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars.

In 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday of May.
