


#### GNJ&PM WALK-A-THON

#### Polly Webb By Heaven Brown

Polly Webb was born in Connecticut in 1779 and she and her friends were the first group of missionaries. While she was being a missionary, Polly had been in a wheelchair since the age of 5, but she did not let that get in her way. She wrote thousands of letters urging others to help them. Polly had more than 20 groups to help them support Boston Female Society for Missionaries.

#### Henrietta Shuck By Brianna Lawson

Henrietta was born in Kilmarnock, VA in 1817. At age 17 she married Rev. Jehu Shuck in 1835. The Shuck's arrived in Macao, China in 1836. The missionaries worked there about 6 years where Henrietta established a small boarding school. In 1842 the missionaries were allowed to move to Hong Kong, making Henrietta the first Western woman there. They established churches and another boarding school that pioneered education for the Chinese girls. Henrietta died at age 27 and was buried in Hong Kong. Kilmarnock called Henrietta "Virginia's Fairest Flower" and her fame was second only to Lottie Moon.

#### Mother Teresa By Esther Hanks

Mother Teresa was born in 1910 in Macedonia. She had a calling to become a nun and involved herself in missionary work in India. She witnessed miracles involving Christ and His teachings. Her legacy will always be her devoted commitment to everyone. She died at the age of 87.
