A MISSIONARY MOMENT

The WMU would like to introduce you to missionaries that have inspired and challenged us. The following are brief introductions to two missionaries that have greatly influenced the WMU. There are many others and we would love to continue to share about them with you. So pull out your books, computer, and smart phones. See what you can find about Henrietta Hall Shuck and Jim Elliot. Write up a brief paragraph like those below and share with the WMU. Your entry might get published here and even read to the congregation!

Lottie Moon

Charlotte D. Moon was born in 1840 in Albemarle County, VA to an affluent family and was afforded many education opportunities not available to young women of that time. Spirited and outspoken, Lottie was indifferent to her Christian upbringing until her early teens when she underwent a spiritual awakening. One of her earliest sharing of the gospel was Romans 12 that foreshadowed her life story. Lottie followed her sister. Edmonia to the North China Mission Station in 1873 on Christmas Eve. Not content to teach school in China, Lottie moved into the interior to evangelize full-time among all classes of Chinese. Her influence was greatly felt throughout China and in the US as she strengthened missionary work and helped establish the WMU. As a living sacrifice, she died on Christmas Eve 1912 at 50 pounds after sharing ALL she had with the Chinese that were in need.

Annie Armstrong

In the late 1800's women were not expected to be leaders, to speak up or to be visionaries. Armstrong was never concerned with what the world expected; she devoted herself to compassion ministry. She was born in 1850 in Baltimore, Maryland. She became a Christian in 1870 at Seventh Baptist Church in Baltimore. She was the first president of the Women's Baptist Home Mission Society and first secretary of the Woman's Missionary Union. Traveling throughout the U.S. Annie encouraged missionaries and challenged churches to give and support missions. She worked hard refusing a salary, "never give to the Lord that which costs me nothing" (2 Samuel 24:24.) Miss Armstrong died in 1938 but her legacy and heart for missions lives on today. Over \$1 billion has been given through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering.
