Where in the Land of Faith Do You Live?

The remarks of the burdened father in Mark 9:24 regarding his cry for help for a suffering child have always caught my attention. "I believe, help thou mine unbelief." There was a measure of faith, and yet at the same moment there was the need for a fuller understanding and commitment to believing what God was able to do.

The place of unbelief in the life of a godly person is intriguing. At first blush we are tempted to say that unbelief is contrary to true faith; that a person who exhibits a lack of belief must be far removed from God. It seems reasonable that the mature will have moved well beyond the weak days of unbelief and no longer struggle in that place of their youth.

But when it comes to unbelief and the faithful, the Bible maps out the paths of hundreds of godly personalities who walked with God but also struggled with unbelief, and these struggles came as often toward the end of their days as during their early years. Adam walked with God in the cool of the Edenic garden. Perfection, beauty, communion, and peace. But very early in the story of the first man and woman to breathe the pure air of new creation they chose to disbelieve God in favor of Satan. We still suffer the consequences of their unbelief today.

Moses and Aaron were constantly dogged by unbelief, an on-again off-again relationship with God that charted the course of a nation for generations. The great king and psalmist David wrestled throughout his life with unbelief. How is it that the writer of such profound wisdom and blessed ruler of such an expanse of territory could stumble into unbelief not once but many times?

Spiritual giants don't come too much larger than Elijah, yet we see this man of God cowering under a desert bush before the perceived threat of a wicked woman...and this just days after Elijah saw God use him to utterly destroy hundreds of prophets of Baal.

Those under the old covenant weren't the only ones to struggle with faith and belief. All of the disciples showed signs of unbelief. Some were doubters of reported fact they hadn't seen with their own eyes while others chose to not believe even while they stared into the eyes of Christ.

In this life we move from crisis to crisis. We are imperfect souls never designed to rest on the mountaintop of unmovable faith. Much of our life is about a journey through shadowy valleys where our faith even at its brightest is but a dim ember compared to what it will be when we are planted eternally at the feet of the Author of Faith. None of this excuses us from what Jesus instructed His disciples and the father of the child in Mark 9. As we recognize our lack of faith we should call out to the Lord to help our unbelief. And we must burn His words deep into our hearts when He says, "This kind can come out only by prayer and fasting."

We see the evidence of much unbelief all around us as we choose to not believe that God can deliver us from apathetic benchwarmers, stingy "givers", ferocious tongue-waggers, deceitful manipulators, lazy "servants", and prayerless decision makers. Our unbelief will leave us sterile when it comes to reaching our communities and growing the Kingdom. It is one thing to have a moment of unbelief, it is quite another to dwell there. Remaining there brings death.
